Please consider joining and being a part of this worthwhile ministry. There is still time to join The Order and be inducted by Bishop Thomas when he is here with us October 2-4.



Dormition of the Theotokos

Upon exiting the nave, one's eyes are drawn to the rear panel of the center ceiling and the magnificent icon of the entrance into Heaven of Our Lady The Theotokos. The Feast is celebrated annually on August 15, and commemorates the repose or "falling asleep" of the Mother of Jesus Christ and the assumption into heaven of the body of The Theotokos.

The Hospitality of Abraham

Genesis 18:1-15 tells the story of three angels described simply as three men who appear to Abraham and Sarah, who treat them with great reverence. When spoken to, the three men respond speaking as one — the one God in three persons — Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

The Four Evangelists

In Christian tradition, the Four Evangelists are Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John, the authors attributed with the creation of the four Gospel accounts in the New Testament. They are called evangelists "people who proclaim good news" (Gospel) of Jesus. Their icons surround and complement our most precious icon, Jesus Christ The Pantocrator.

RESURRECTION TROPARION - Tone 4 - Having learned the joyful message of the resurrection from the angel, the women disciples of the Lord cast from them their parental condemnation, and proudly broke the news to the disciples saying, Death hath been spoiled. Christ God is risen, granting the world great mercy!
