Prostrations

Prostrations are liturgically appropriate in various services throughout the Ecclesiastical year, most especially during the services of great Lent and Holy week. We normally do not prostrate or kneel on Sundays, in honor of the resurrection.

Wednesday Services and Bible Study

Beginning September 4, we will have the service of the Psalms and Kathisma prayers each Wednesday at 6 pm, followed by a Bible study and light refreshments.
