## A Guide to Parish Etiquette

The respectful protocol is to leave the church only following the final blessing, the veneration of the Cross, and the kissing of the hand of the Bishop or Priest at the end of the Liturgy. Socializing should not begin until after you have left the nave and entered the social hall.
