The Blessed man is emptied Ps. 1:1

Does not walk in the wrong direction

Note the similarities between Joshua and blessed man.

Joshua 1:7-8

be strong and very courageous, being careful to do according to all the law that Moses my servant commanded you. Do not turn from it to the right hand or to the left, that you may have good **success** wherever you go. ⁸ This Book of the Law shall not depart from your mouth, but you shall **meditate on it day and night**, so that you may be careful to do according to all that is written in it. For then you will make your way **prosperous**, and then you will have good success.

Psalms 1:1-3

Blessed is the man who walks not in the counsel of the wicked, nor stands in the way of sinners, nor sits in the seat of scoffers; ² but his delight is in the law of the LORD, and on his law he **meditates day and night**. ³ He is like a tree planted by streams of water that **yields its fruit** in its season, and its leaf does not wither. In all that he does, he **prosperes**.
