NATIVITY FAST

November 15 to
December 24

CROSSING ONESELF

It is always appropriate to make the sign of the cross at:

- The mention of the Holy Trinity - Father, Son and Holy Spirit
- Entering and leaving the Holy Church
- At the beginning of the Divine Liturgy
- When passing in front of the Royal Doors of the Holy Alter
- Anytime for personal prayers

When the Priest is blessing or censuring the icons or congregation, it is proper to bow your head and receive the blessing. One may also cross oneself if so inclined.
