In 2019, our weekly attendance has increased by 9% year-to-year and we have received a record number of 81 pledges. Through your generosity we were able to install a new PA system enabling our services and our Choir to be heard throughout the entire building. We completed construction of the new shed and rear stairs, installed three new icons in the Sanctuary and twelve new icons in the foyer, and placed a new candle stand in memory of Father Boniface Black. Our Annual Yard and Bake Sale in May was our most successful ever!

A Guide to Parish Etiquette

Veneration of Icons

The proper way to reverence an icon is to make the sign of the cross, kiss either the hands or feet of the saint depicted in the icon, or the scroll, Gospel book or cross the saint is holding, then once again make the sign of the cross. Please remove lipstick before kissing the icon.
